### 【特色】

- ①戦時中の1944年(昭和19) OSS(Office of Strategic Service 米諜報機関)が作成した汪兆銘の人名録を底本にして復刻。
- ②「ウェード式」(ラテン文字表記)や「ピンイン」(中国語の発音記号)の人名録の対照表を作成(解題)。
- ③汪兆銘政権の組織図(解題)掲載。
- ④汪兆銘は「傀儡」「汪偽」「PUPPET」という評価で良いのか。
- ⑤汪兆銘政権に送り込まれた国民党と共産党の諜報員はいったい誰なのか。
- ⑥英語で書かれた解題(英語の参考文献)を収録。

The Wang Jingwei (Wang Ching-wei) Government: A survey of archival and secondary sources by Tai Wei LIM (Senior Lecturer Singapore University of Social Sciences and National University of Singapore Research Fellow Adjunct). Work in progress, no circulation embargo until delivery.
Introduction. This writing is a survey of secondary sources related to Wang Jingwei (1883-1944) and his pro-Japanese administration supported by the Japanese government. It is an attempt to first curate original information about the topic of Chinese collaborationism during the Sino-Japanese War (1937 to 1945) and also the Pacific War (1941-1945). It focuses on the Wang Jingwei regime in particular as this regime was recognized as the major backbone of pro-Japan factions within the Chinese political elite circles in the duration of the two wars. Yun Xiu-an that the primary purpose for setting up the pro-Japanese regimes was the pragmatic reason: control over a large territory. In order to effectively control the occupied territory with limited manpower, Japan supported the Reformed Government (Weixin zhengfu, 1938-1940) in Nanjing, led by Wang Ken and the Provisional Government (Linshi zhengfu) in Beijing, headed by Wang Jingwei. Japan sponsored a controlled occupied regions in North China. In March 1940, Japan sponsored a National Government (Nanjiang gumon) in Nanjing headed by Wang Jingwei. This regime replaced the Reformed Government and the Provisional Government, and their important bureaucrats. The administration in Nanjing 南京 operated from March 1940 to August 1945. Sino-Japanese war and later Pacific war period of 1937-1945. The origins of Wang's regime trace back to the "Peace Movement" (Heiping yundong and 和平運動) established in 1935. On 26 October 1938, Chen Bijun, Chen Gongbo, Zhou Fohai, Mei Siping, and Yan Xun gathered in Chongqing to discuss collaboration with the Japanese under the cover of Chen Bijun overcame Chen Gongbo's resistance to this decision within the group. In 1938, Gao Zongwu (高宗武) and Mei Siping approached members of the Japanese Shanghai to set up what would eventually become the Wang Jingwei pro-Japanese pro-Japanese Wang Jingwei deflection from Chongqing happened in December 1939. The thesis statement in this writing argues that (1) perceptions of collaboration
